The Big Picture

As a youngster of six or seven years old, I spent some extended holidays at my grandparent's farm near Keyneton just outside the Barossa. One of the things my older brother and I loved to do was muck around in the dry creek beds. There were always interesting things to do and build, particularly in one area where we would mine the damp clay, out of which we would make all kinds of figures and constructions.

One day, quite out of the blue for us, a huge wall of water came rushing down the creek bed. There had been a heavy thunderstorm up in the hills. My brother was quicker than me and he got out of the creek. Thankfully he was able to grab me and help me up the steep bank of the creek, but not before I got a real shock and was soaked up to my chest.



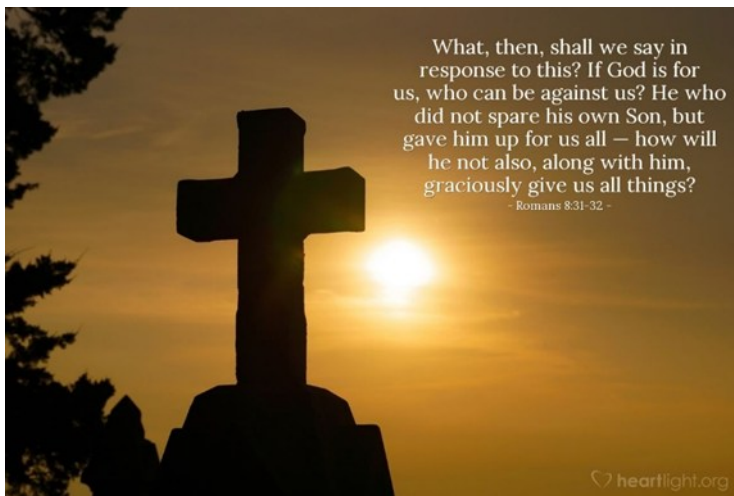
We went back to the farmhouse feeling shaken but fortunate to have escaped drowning, only to get one hang of a scolding by Granny for getting my clothes wet and dirty. I loved my Grandma but I sure felt that at the time, she hadn't seen the big picture, and that she had majored on the minor.

How easy isn't it along our journeys of life to miss the big picture, and major on the minors! I can certainly attest to that, when maybe an issue or a problem is dragging me down. The whole world starts to feel bleak and dismal. It is then that I need to remind myself of the big picture- yes my trousers might be wet and dirty, but I am alive and kicking!

The Apostle Paul had that great gift of seeing the big picture and putting things in perspective, so that we can travel the road of life positively and joyfully. When he writes to the believers at Rome in chapter 8 of his letter, he acknowledges the real problems that are being faced. Paul is saying to the Christians in Rome, 'yeah things are tough- there's persecution and suffering- and things are going to get even tougher for you guys. But let's look at the big picture- "If God is for us who can be against us?"' If your creator God, the creator of the whole universe loves you and has your present and eternal interests deep in his heart, then other things, as much of a reality as they are, pale by comparison. If God gave his Son for you, he isn't going to hold back the gift of salvation. If Christ gave his life for you, he isn't going to turn around and condemn you- no matter how bad things are, no matter how tough you are doing it, no matter how hard life is pressing in on you.

He will not withhold anything you need to live for him. These words of Paul encourage the people at Rome to look at the big picture and to live confidently and joyfully. They are also addressed to you personally as you confront the ups and downs of life.

As Paul says: *“In all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth [nor dirty and wet trousers], nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.”*



What is God's big picture plan for us as congregations of the Mid Murray parish? Yes, of course he wants us to know that we are his loved and cared for children through Jesus, and to live joyfully in that confidence. And he calls us to be the Body of Christ in the communities where he has planted our churches. That means shining the light and love of Jesus into our communities in any way that we can. God's big picture is to draw all people to himself in a relationship that brings hope and peace to lives that are fraught with hurt, anxiety and hopelessness. May God guide and empower our parish and church families to seek his ways and be part of his big picture plan in our small part of the world.



We can so often sweat the small stuff that doesn't serve the big picture. We can so easily give our energies over to things that in the big picture don't really matter. Maybe you've had a disagreement with someone or have felt slighted by them - how can you turn this into a situation that brings God's love, even when you find it hard to love?

God wants each of us to joyfully be part of his big picture plan on our life's journey. God's peace and joy be yours as you share that journey in your family, in your friendship circles, in your church, your community circles and this world where you have been planted in God's big picture.

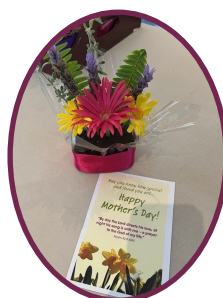
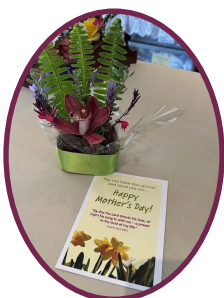
Harvest Thanksgiving

– we were led in worship by Pastor Bryan as one of our visiting Pastors.

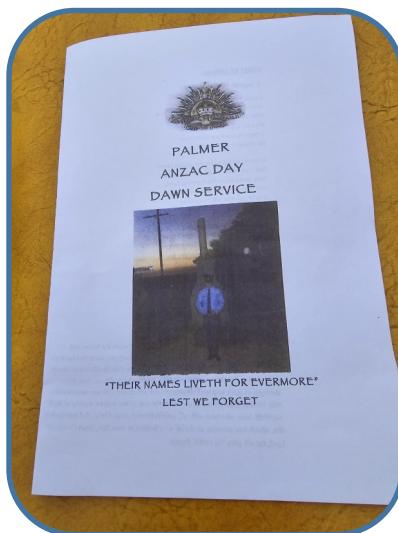

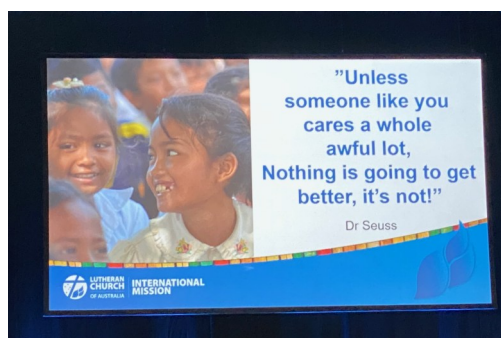
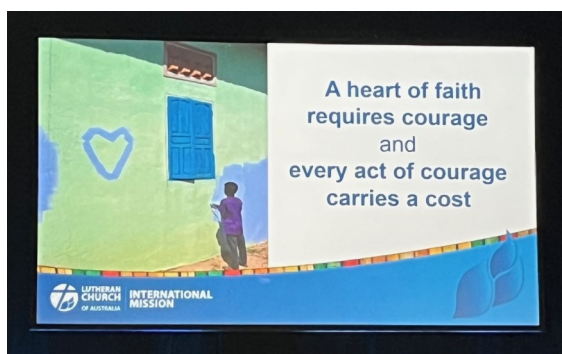


Happy Anniversary

This year we honoured former resident and ex- service member Colin Arnold Krollig and welcomed members of his extended family and friends to our service.

Colin enlisted in the Royal Australian Air Force on 21 July 1942 during the Second World War. He served as a Leading Aircraftman, working in aircraft repair and salvage—roles believed to have been based in both Darwin and Borneo. His service included a wide range of responsibilities, from ground crew aircraft maintenance to communications and other specialised tasks vital to the war effort.

Following the conclusion of the war, Colin was honourably discharged on 6 May 1946.

His eldest son Brenton proudly wears replicas of his father’s medals, which include:

- The 1939–1945 Star*
- The Pacific Star*
- The Defence Medal*
- The 1939–1945 War Medal*
- The Australian Service Medal*

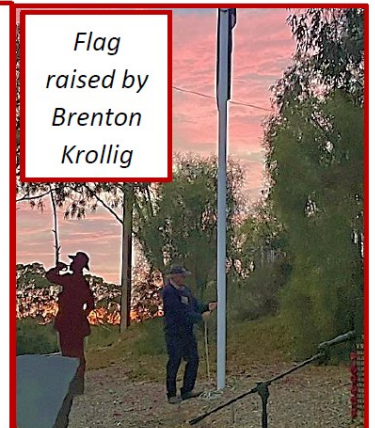

THINKING OF STARTING A NEW MINISTRY?

Among the helpful information on the LCA's Congregational Life website hub are general resources for mission and ministry, including what to consider if your congregation plans to start a ministry.

Starting a ministry can be exciting and rewarding. It can also be unpredictable and frustrating and takes time and energy. Remember that if God leads you to start something new, he will be with you throughout.



DOES THE MINISTRY MEET A NEED?

- Before starting a new ministry, it is important to consider whether it meets a true need in your community. Ask the following:
 - Is the need real or imagined? Is there any data that you can gather?
 - Is it a general need supported by most of the congregation or simply being championed by a few vocal people?
 - Can the ministry offer a meaningful or effective way to meet the need?
 - Is the need already being met elsewhere? There may already be another church or local organisation offering something similar. Maybe a partnership is a better idea. Your support could be more effective than creating a competing program.
 - Is there something you should stop in order to start this? You don't want to overstretch your resources.



TIPS FOR STARTING A NEW MINISTRY

- Leadership is critical to the success of any ministry. For a new ministry to be successful, leaders must do lots of planning and work. Consider the following:
 - 1. Establish support**

Don't do it by yourself. Build and develop a team which will go on the journey with you. Look for people who will share your passion and vision for the ministry you are proposing. Get to know them and their heart for ministry.
 - 2. Mission and vision**

Determine your ministry's mission and vision. Make sure it aligns with the congregation. What is your purpose? What are your goals? What group of people will you target? Incorporate your ministry focus into the ministry name if possible.
 - 3. Develop a ministry plan**

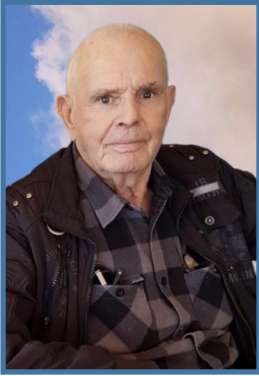
A solid ministry plan built on sustained prayer and practical strategies is important. Write down your goals and the strategies to achieve them. Ask what is needed to start the ministry, where you will get the resources, how much it will cost, how you will fundraise and who else you need to involve.
 - 4. Establish a timeline**

Set deadlines for building your team, doing the groundwork, raising your budget, launching your ministry, etc. Take time to complete each step before moving to the next. Track your progress and share it with your prayer team and congregation.
 - 5. Communicate**

Tell people in your congregation and parish you are starting a ministry. When the time is right, advertise and promote it in as many ways as possible – website, social media, fliers, bulletins and announcements.
 - 6. Review and improve**

Once you launch your ministry, the real work begins. Schedule regular reviews. Be proactive about getting people together to celebrate, share what you've learnt and talk about changes that can help to improve your ministry.

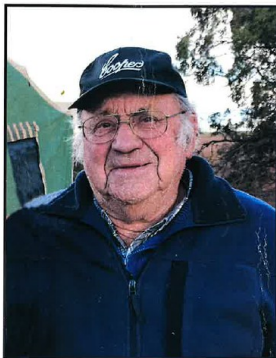
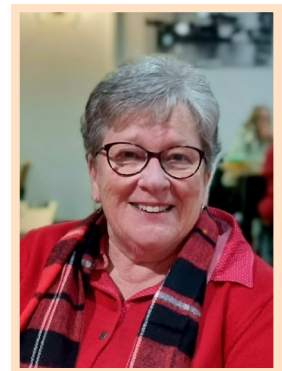
